


Informing Decisions

If you need an assistant/service dog but don't know where to start, the following suggested checklist may be useful when interviewing potential service providers (organizations or trainers). If a service provider refuses to answer your questions and will not provide written confirmation of what was verbally stated, it would be wise to continue your search. Ultimately, the decision is yours. The enclosed talking points are merely suggestions. Best wishes!

Are service dogs provided at no charge, or do you charge your clients a fee?	<input type="checkbox"/>
